The growth of St. Peter's ministry has been as a result of collective effort. That is why each and every one's effort is appreciated. All departments are appreciated for their hard work and please continue. I also thank my colleague Rev. Dr. Alex Kasirye-Musoke for his more frequent availability among us despite his being fully committed elsewhere. His effort is most commendable and we would be very glad if that trend could continue. Christ Church as always has been of support. We have enjoyed tremendous support from them for almost three years now. They have been very gracious to us, and that in itself is a living out of the gospel to us. This has fitted excellently with the direction St. Peter's exists to go in its mission, namely, reconciliation between humans and God and also between humans themselves.

Baptism: We had an addition of 20 members to our congregation through baptism and many re-affirmed their faith and/or committed their lives to God

Confirmation: 15 persons were confirmed.

Weddings: St. Peter's had its first wedding last year. We also had so many that we sent out to Uganda

Bishop's visit: We did not have a bishop's visit last year. The bishop of Massachusetts will be visiting us this month January 23, 2011.

Sunday attendance: Sunday attendance has improved from the average of 100 to 120 per any given Sunday. Of course that means some Sundays were less than that and some far more than that. I thank you all who have been so faithful in coming. As usual I would remind every member of the duty of lay persons in the church. Every individual Christian's 24/7 duty is to emulate Christ and bear witness to Him; to always worship God, especially at home but also in a place of worship with other believers; to do the work of God; to pray and to offer money according to her/his means for the support of the work of the Church at home and overseas; and to fight the good fight of faith and lay hold on eternal life. And the duty of all Christians corporately is to follow Christ; to come together week by week for corporate worship; and to work, pray, and give of their resources for the spread of the kingdom of God.

Giving: Our Sunday offerings have improved and I wish to thank all of you. Indeed you have given money, time, and talents. Financially, you have given through offertory, pledges, Harvesting Sunday (Makungula) and the Annual Fundraising Dinner. All glory to the Master. Now I ask you again to prayerfully think of how much you can increase in your giving so we have enough resources to run the church programs without undue roadblocks. The treasurer will elaborate on the finances in his report.

Visitors: We had many people who visited us this year and they are too many to mention. Allow me, however, to point out just a few: Taata Samwiri Kibazo, Rev. Canon Grace Ndyabahika, the Ven. Isaac Kijjambu, archdeacon of Luzira in Namirembe Diocese. The Rt. Rev. Jackson Matovu sent his regards when he visited Canada last year. The Rt. Rev. Stephen Kazimba, Bishop of Mityana Diocese also sent us his greetings from Uganda.

Growth: As you know, St Peter's gave birth to another congregation, St. John's Episcopal Church, which meets at Lowell and is led by my colleague the Rev. Mary Tusubira. I ask you to continue praying for that congregation to grow and meet the needs of the people in that area.

Personal commitment: And once again I would like to declare to you all and to the entire St. Peter's family that I am ready to serve you with all the strength I can garner. My only condition is that you align with me so we face the same direction. If we have that unity, the year 2011 promises to be a year of exorbitant blessings of God on the ministry of St. Peter's.

Our church has continued to register positive achievements as enumerated below:

More space and more time: Following the departure of Maranatha congregation, we now can use more space without stringent time limit. However, this freedom came with a price of more than double increase in rental fees.

Policy and procedure documents: On 10/3/2010 we introduced the Sunday school and Fire Safety policy and procedure documents. Special thanks to the legal committee chaired by Omulongo Kato Kajubi, for designing these documents to suit the needs of our congregation.

Pledges (obweyamo): A successful session was organized on May/30/2010 to sensitize parishioners on pledges. Special thanks to Mr. Katumba Herbert for the wonderful presentation on this day. The outcome of this session showed a positive trend in the

new pledges. I also thank all those who pledged and were able to fulfill their pledges last year.

However, I earnestly appeal to those who have never pledged to do so, bearing in mind that budget projection is mainly based on regular pledges.

Building Fund (Obuzimbi): Plans for improving building fund collections were stepped up last year. Spearheaded by the finance committee, a successful fundraising dinner was organized on November/28/2010. Cheers to the organizing committee which was chaired by M/s Edith Ndagire for the astounding outcome from this maiden fundraising dinner. And truly, the support from the parishioners and well-wishers was also appreciated. Please be all aware that organizing for this kind of fundraising dinner is going to be an annual event for St. Peter's Church, with the long term goal of having our own home of worship.

Financial quarterly reports: We have maintained to have the treasurer's report presented to the congregation every three months. This arrangement is aimed at enhancing transparency and accountability.

Harvesting (Makungula): October/24/2010 was the harvesting day for St. Peter's church, it was marked with great success. Total collections of the day reflected a tremendous improvement compared to the previous years.

Website upgrade: www.saintpetersanglican.org is St. Peter's Church website for online pledges and donations. You can always find the website on our Sunday service program. I thank all those who have fulfilled their pledges and donations online.

Suggestion box: We have a suggestion box in place. It is located on the wall right before the office entrance upstairs. Your suggestions should only be for the building and strengthening our Christian family of St. Peter's. You are at liberty to remain anonymous with your suggestions in this box.

2011 Calendar: St. Peter's Church calendars for this year 2011 are already out and on sale. Please acquaint yourself with your calendar to know the events which will be happening across the year. Thanks to M/s Edith Ndagire and others, who took the responsibility to produce these calendars.

Church car: We continue facilitating our priest-in-charge with transport. A Toyota Camry 2010 on a three years lease contract is in place to this effect.

Children's Christmas party: The Sunday school department in liaison with Christ Church organized the children's X-mass party on December/18/2010. We congratulate them for this occasion which was a great success.

X-mass carols: We had X-mass carols on December 19, 2010. Unlike last year, the cold was biting, but the roads were non slippery. I thank all those who participated in the X-mass carols making the occasion colorful. The organizers are also thanked in a special way.

Prayer books: As you are all aware, we now have prayer books written in our own vernacular as a property of St Peter's Church. We still thank Mrs. Robina Njuba for the donation of these books. (10 copies of prayer books and 11 copies of bibles) Disappointingly however, these numbers are dwindling. We need to jealously keep these books as a gesture of appreciation to the donor. The door remains open and cheers on hold for any future donor.

FUTURE PLANS

Elections: As a vestry committee, our term of service is ending this year. We are going to make the necessary arrangements to organize the election of new leaders in July/2011. Details about these elections will be communicated as they unfold.

We are going to continue working on policy and procedure documents that are still pending. A Church handbook is also in the pipeline.

Christian Women's Fellowship Report

Aim and objectives of the Christian Women Fellowship

The main aim of this Fellowship/Organization is to bring the Christian women of St Peter's Church together in Christ, love, respect, and to help one another in times of need due to physical, emotional or financial catastrophes.

Achievements in 2010

Munno Mukabi Account

In view of the above stipulated aims, a special account to help fellowship members in financial needs due to problems beyond their control such as physical ailments or loss of income which could lead to both emotional and financial incapacitation was set up in 2008. This account with a contribution of \$ 20 per month from each member has continued to grow and prosper, throughout the financial year of 2010 helping a sizable number of fellowship members who have experienced financial setbacks.

Reading Scripture during Church Services

The Chairwoman of the fellowship, Margaret Bukirwa, brought a proposal to allow members of the congregation to participate in Bible Readings during Church services on Sundays. This proposal was implemented and was enthusiastically embraced by all church members there by giving opportunity for the members to actively engage in their church and at the same time to encourage members to learn and polish their Luganda language.

Social Activities

- The Women Fellowship has been actively engaged in organizing social events like, preparing and giving a Luncheon to our fellow Christian men on Mother's day. A number of luncheons were also organized by the women fellowship on a number of occasions during services on Sundays, in conjunction with the Hospitality Department
- The women actively participated in the Fundraising event that took place on 28th November, 2010; some of them showcased their talents by donating some of the Hand made crafts like ear rings which were sold to raise money for the church.

Challenges in 2010 and how to overcome them

- The biggest challenge has been lack of enthusiasm on the part of the women congregation of the church to attend meetings and give new ideas and proposals to help improve and build our organization. I am therefore appealing to all of the

women to support our fellowship by attending meetings regularly when ever they're called upon.

- Another challenge has been lack of enthusiasm to contribute the \$ 20 towards our Munno Mukabi Fund. This Fund could be a big factor in women's lives if supported adequately, because human life is so full of unforeseeable circumstances, where money from this fund could become handy. Please women contribute faithfully to this fund.

How Can the Vestry and congregation help the Women's Christian Fellowship?

- The vestry and congregation can help us by giving us some good and bright ideas on how to improve our fellowship, because we're open to new ideas.
- The vestry should play a big part by encouraging women to participate in reading the scripture during Sunday's services. Many women are still shy to come forward and read scripture in front of the congregation

Plans for the Women Department in 2011

- We want to encourage and promote women's talents in hand crafting or home made crafting. Women should be encouraged to show case their talents by making hand crafts like making emikeeka, Jewelry like necklaces and earrings, sowing knitting and painting. These crafts should be the ones to be auctioned during fund raising drives for our church, and also to sell them to each other and the congregation.
- We want to encourage women to stop back biting each other and avoid creating unnecessary intrigues between one another. Women would be encouraged to foster the spirit of openness by talking over matters which have not gone well with one another, instead of complaining behind the scenes. God wants children who love each other and in case of any misgivings, to iron them out smoothly and quickly by asking God to guide and forgive them and by apologizing.
- Women should be encouraged to participate in the affairs of our Sunday school children and youth by teaching them traditional mannerism at home i.e. how to treat elderly parents and how to cope with the challenges in life by praying to god, read and understand the scriptures and attending church. The church choir still needs more members and women should learn to sacrifice their time and join the choir, to help our church.

Treasurer Report

Once again I'm standing in front of you highlighting God's work in the year of our Lord 2010. I would like to thank the congregation, vestry, clergy and the finance committee for the work well done last year.

My report as like previous financial reports is all about income and expenditures in God's work. I have tried to highlight means of sustaining, long self-sustaining and developmental mechanisms for our church. I have made calls for support and you heard and answered the calls, thank you for the unwavering support you have shown in God's work.

Looking on the past year, I would like to focus our minds to way forward, let's ponder about that in this coming year.

Income

Special attention needs to be given to our building fund. This is an account that despite numerous talks about it has not seen significant improvement. However, with our recently concluded fundraising dinner, we see a spike in this account's activities in terms of what's going into it. It was decided that our annual fundraising dinners will be solely for building fund. As pointed out before from the organizing committee, this is going to be an annual event for St. Peters church.

Also I would like to point out to the annual Makungula fundraiser. Last year was also a success, with more people getting to understand what this means for them church developmental goals

Of great importance is Bweyamo account. I would like to remind you all that, church budgeting and planning greatly depends on this account with the programs. I would like to take this opportunity to remind each and every one to pledge during this month and the coming one, to allow us cover this year's budget which we will present to you in the coming weeks.

I would like to talk about individual accounts like the "Men's account, Women's, Mother's Union". These accounts are run and operated by these individual groups. However, they entrust their funds with the treasurer's office. Also, these groups have different means of getting funds from their members, and their spending decisions come from their members BUT this brings in some friction within membership on what, and how to run their funds. There is need to streamline this with departmental heads, and I would like to see ONLY departmental heads about money issues coming to the treasurer.

Expenditures:

There is an increase in our expenses. This is something we have to cope with but at the same time curtail some expenditure on some things we have control about. There is an increase in compensations as well as rent and facilities expenses. As you may all know, St Peter's took over rent payment responsibilities for the hall downstairs in order to have more time on the premises.

Another big expenditure that's growing bigger is the congregational life/hospitality bit. There is a tremendous increase in what we are spending on ourselves though this all well deserved. We need to do more about this department. I am proposing to have less coming out, so this department will be running on a balanced budget, i.e. what goes in, will be the only coming out.

In general I would like to congratulate ourselves for all hard work, love of God and the spirit towards each other in this past year. I hope we will do more to enhance and develop our spiritual lives for this New Year.
